We are currently working through a 'Vision' series on Sundays. It is our chance to think about what kind of church we should be. At St Stephen's we want our sense of purpose and place to be primarily shaped by the Bible and its great story.

We live in an age of pessimism and hopelessness. Yet amid this age, the story of God's rescues, his love for the world, his control over the ultimate outcome of all things, and his willingness to show mercy, provides us with hope and cause for optimism. His church should be optimistic about his plans and the church's place in them. We are optimistic not because of who we are but who God is. We are optimistic because of the message of hope Jesus brings.

Prayers for those not sharing in Lord's Supper

Participation in the Lord's Supper is for those who have professed faith in Jesus - it's a powerful and important symbol of the Christian message. As such we want to encourage those who are still exploring the Christian faith to feel free to remain in their seats when others move to the front to receive the Lord's Supper. During that time you may want to reflect on the sermon or Bible reading. You may also want to pray one of these prayers below.

Prayer for those searching for truth

Lord Jesus, you claim to be the way, the truth, and the life. Grant that I might be undaunted by the cost of following you as I consider the reasons for doing so. If what you claim is true, please guide me, teach me, and open to me who you are. Give me an understanding of you that leads to the life that you promise. Amen.

Prayer of belief

Lord Jesus, I admit that I am weaker and more sinful than I ever before believed, but through you I am more loved and accepted than I ever dared hope. I thank you for paying my dept, bearing my punishment on the cross, and offering forgiveness and new life. Knowing that you have been raised from the dead, I turn from my sins and receive you as Saviour and Lord. Amen.

Prayer for those struggling with sin

Lord Jesus, enable me to lay aside the sin that clings so closely, and run with perseverance the race set before me, looking to you, the pioneer and perfecter of my faith. Amen.

1. What can shake your confidence in God's plan for his church? How do you respond at such times?

Read Ephesians 3:14-21

Use as many questions as you need to ensure you understand the passage's contents.

- 1. How does Paul describe God?
- 2. What does he ask for? List the various aspects of his request.
- 3. What role does Christ play in his request?
- 4. What is the role of the church in this prayer?
- 2. Why should prayer be the 1st characteristic of God's church as they seek to live out their identity in the world?

3. What impedes our prayer life – either stopping it or lowering the hopes of our prayers?

4. What is the gospel story? What hopes does it present to God's people? How can these fuel our prayer life?

5. What does your group need to do so that you continually shape your prayers around the Gospel story? Identify ways your regular meeting can ensure this happens.

For this reason, we want to be shaping our hearts around the gospel and see those heartfelt convictions pour out in our prayers.
