Gospel and Prayer (GaP) Group Study

1. When do you find it hardest to trust God?

Read Exodus 13:17-14:31

Getting your head around the passage:

Choose as many of these questions as you need to get your head around the passage.

- A. What are some signs in the passage that God is in control?
- B. What reaction do the Israelites have when they see the Egyptians?
- C. How does Moses respond to their complaints?
- D. What do the Egyptians come to realise about Israel?
- E. How do the Israelites respond after they have crossed the sea and see the fate of the Egyptians?
- 2. The Israelites are depicted as being ready for battle when they leave Egypt, yet God deliberately steers them away from confrontation with the Philistines. Why do you think this is?
- 3. What does it mean for God to receive glory (in verses 4, 17 and 18)?
- 4. How could our preoccupation with our immediate circumstances work against God's glory?

5. How should we feel about the destruction of the Egyptians depicted at the end of the passage? Is that how you felt reading those words?

6. What causes you to doubt that God has overcome the powers of this world in your life?

7. In what ways does God's rescue of Israel here parallel our salvation in Christ?

Prayer Time

- 1. Reflect on your response to question 7. Pray for God's forgiveness and that He would make you more aware of these hazards.
- 2. What actions or habits could you develop to strengthen your trust in God in those moments? Pray for His assistance in developing them.

- 1. What does God want to achieve?
- 2. What is our role?
- 3. Ask God to remind you of your new status in Him.


Finances
