Read Exodus 16

- B. How does God respond? (v4-5)
- C. How do the Israelites go with God's instructions from v4-5? (v15-27)
- D. How does the story conclude? (v31-36)
- 2. Read Ex 7:16. How does the Israelites' response in Ex 16 contrast this?

3. Why can grumbling be such a bad thing for both the Israelites and us?

4. What makes it hard for you to trust in God as your Provider?
Read John 6:35-51 5. What are the similarities and differences between this passage and Exodus 16?
6. How might seeing Jesus as the true 'Bread of Life' satisfy our hearts?

Prayer Time

- 1. Spend some time praying that God would grow our hearts in seeing Jesus as the true Bread of Life.
- 2. Pray that God would grow our hearts in gratitude to Him rather than grumbling.
