Bible Study

1. What product/experience/topic are you the most passionate advocate for? Why? 2. Summarise the gospel in a few sentences. Read Romans 1:1-17 What are the key features of the gospel highlighted by Paul in verses 2-7? 3. Note down how each person of the Trinity is portrayed as working. 4. How would you summarise the gospel from these verses? 5. What are the similarities and differences between your answers to questions 2 and 4? 6. What is Paul's desire in verses 10-12?

7. Why is he so passionate about this?

- 8. Paul talks about mutual encouragement in verse 12. Are there any relationships in your life that reflect this verse? How can you foster such relationships?
- 9. How have you seen God working His power in your life in the last week? Month? Year?
- 10. What rhythms could you establish that help you regularly reflect on how God is working in your life?
- 11. Who is someone you can encourage by pointing to a work of God you've observed in their life recently?
- 12. What difference does being unashamed of the gospel make in your home? Workplace? Social circles? Day-to-day interactions?
- 13. Do you feel pressure to have a smooth, compelling pitch for the gospel before you start sharing?
- 14. What truths in this passage (or elsewhere) comfort and reassure you as you attempt to share your faith?

Prayer and Act

1. Spend a few moments praying about what you've learned. Ask God to give you boldness and trust in His power to save. Pray for specific people in your life who need to hear the good news of Jesus.


