A Prayer of Confession

Most merciful God,

Have mercy on us:

wipe out our sins and teach us to forgive others.

Bring forth in us the fruit of the Spirit

that we may live as disciples of Christ.

Gospel and Prayer (GaP) Group Study

1. What's the most exciting or unexpected news you've ever received about something that would happen in the future? How did it change your perspective or plans in the lead up to this future?

Read 1 Corinthians 15:12-34

Getting your head around the passage:

Choose as many of these questions as you need to get your head around the passage.

- A. What are all the implications of saying there is no resurrection of the dead? (v. 12-19) What's the logic?
- B. What are all the implications of Christ being raised from the dead (v. 20-28)?
- C. How does believing and preaching in the resurrection change our present lifestyle and life ambitions (v. 29-34)?
- 2. Think about a non-Christian friend/colleague/family member that has a very different lifestyle to you. How do your separate beliefs about the resurrection impact how you both live? Does it?

3. What makes it tempting as a Christian to be caught up in worldly desires/pursuits/lifestyles? How does our guaranteed resurrection help us fight against this?

- 4. How can the picture of everything being place under Christ's feet (v. 24-28) in the end change how you:
 - a. See what's really important in the day to day
 - b. Approach a particular hardship/suffering you're experiencing at the moment
 - c. Relate to your non-Christian friend/family

5. What are you most looking forward to in the resurrection life?

Prayer Time

- 1. Share with each other what you have been convicted by in the passage and pray for each other.
- 2. Spend time praising God for raising Christ from the dead and guaranteeing our resurrection from the dead and life eternal.

- 1. The effect of sin and death on me/humanity.
- 2. The power and love of God over sin and death
