# Growing the young in their devotion to God's word.

What ways can you participate in the parish's mission? Pray that the Lord might raise up sufficient workers and resources to reach the 1000s of young people in our area.

#### Leaders' Notes

This study is the beginning of our series concentrating on the second half of Mark's Gospel. We will use the series to prepare us for Easter and provide an easy entry for visitors and non-Christians who engage with our services.

In the passage we have two very contrasting pictures of Jesus. Matt described them as two mountains. The 1st mountain is where the transfiguration took place. A secret insight into the power of Christ given to his 3 closest disciples but made available now to us in their eyewitness accounts. We have a tendency to domesticate Jesus - to make him good but not the one great God. He is not like the prophets who simply reflected God's glory - he is the glory of God (Heb 1:3).

In the 2nd image (8:31-38) Jesus is the suffering servant, the one who is offered up on a Roman Cross. This may seem inglorious. In actual fact this is place of his highest glory. While the Transfiguration is mind-blowing, the Cross is where his power is most effective - there he shields us from God's power by destroying the impact of sin and death.

Use the study to challenge your group to consider where they minimise Jesus's character and how the true Christ might reshape our lives. Don't miss the application time rather give your groups enough time to consider those questions.
