- 3. Who is Jesus telling the stories to? How does that impact your reading?
- 4. How does the crowd respond to Jesus's teachings?
- 2. The Greek word for 'lost' can also mean 'destroy, ruin, cut off'. How willing are you to say the whole world is 'lost'? Why/why not?

3. What, in our life and experience, testifies to our 'lostness' prior to coming to faith?

- 4. What is the hope of these parables?
- 5. How do these parables encourage us to be active in bringing our friends to faith?

6. What do you need to do?

- 2. What encouraging stories of faith sharing have you heard recently?

Vision Month Week - 3


