- 3. Summarise the warning in verse 8. How is this warning an extension of Paul's encouragement in verses 6-7?
- 4. What reasons does Paul give in verses 9-15 for not needing to be taken captive by other philosophies?
- 2. How is Christian progress (continuing to live with Christ as Lord unique) from other life pursuits?

3. How did you receive Christ as Lord? How were you captivated by His Cross? Discuss.

4. How can we (as a group) continue to live rooted in Christ and built ourselves up in the faith?

5. What are some deceptive philosophies that might take us away from trusting in Christ and His Cross?

- 2. How can we continue to help each other to be deeply rooted in God's word?

Prayer Morning - 5th November


The Life Course
