- 4. What part does Jesus play in these encouragements?
- 2. What reasons do we have for being wary of submission as posture toward others?

3. How does Paul address these concerns in this part of the letter?

Read Philippians 2:5-11

4. If Jesus is the model for all parties in the Colossians passage, how are our fears and uncertainties answered?

GaP Group Reflection Watch the video provided to your group leader.

- 1. Consider the friends you have who do not know Christ. Are they comfortable talking with you about faith issues? How can you deepen that friendship so you can more readily speak about them?
- 2. Share some stories of times you've seen Christians be generous to others and the encouragement you have found.

- Pray for spouses/parents/workers/employees of your group. Ask God to grant wisdom, godliness, submissiveness, loving, and just hearts.

Kids Program in 2023!

As we inch closer to the end of 2022, now would be a great time to plan what kid's ministry at St. Stephen's is going to look like in 2023. The strategy we have developed for kids and youth ministry is as follows. In partnership with families, we want to flood a pathway that takes children ages 1-18 from unbelief to biblically shaped active faith.



Starting next year, we are creating a path specifically designed for kids from Kindergarten to Year four. We will launch a Kid's Club that will run on Friday afternoons. It will be a place where our Christian kids can bring their friends to hear about Jesus. This club is a great idea because:

- 1. There are many non-Christian families in our area.
- 2. Midweek is a more accessible time to families than Sunday.
- 3. Early primary school is a time in the lives of families when they are open to the gospel and trying new activities.
- 4. We have lots of church kids moving into this demographic next year.
