1. Think of all the reasons why we find evangelism hard. Which of these reasons are down to us (i.e. internal factors)? Which of these reasons are not down to us (i.e. external factors)?

Read Colossians 4:2-6

- 1. What should our prayer be marked by (v. 2)? What do you think this means?
- 2. What does Paul ask us to prayer for (vv. 3-4)? What do you think this means?
- 3. How should we act towards non-Christians, and why?
- 4. What should be the nature of our conversation with non-Christians, and why? (v. 6)
- 2. Why do you think Paul gives us instructions on evangelistic prayer and witness as his last instructions in Colossians?

3. Discuss this quote summarised from Sam Chan's book, *How to Talk about Jesus (Without Being That Guy)*:

"To overcome the higher barriers to evangelism today, Christians need to be more involved in the lives of non-Christians, whether it is attending events that matter to them, showing hospitality through meals...It also means that listening (and asking questions) matters as much as talking, to understand the people with whom we share. Telling simple stories about Jesus or sharing the story of Jesus in your life is a powerful way of evangelising through our conversations."

- 4. Which of the following statements best represents you, and why?
 - (a) "I have no problem making friends with non-Christians, but I find it hard to mention Jesus in those friendships."
 - (b) "My non-Christian friends know about my faith, but none wants to talk about it, and none have taken up my invitations to come to church events."
 - (c) "I'm relatively confident talking to others about Jesus, but I don't have many close non-Christian friendships."
- 5. How can we help each other in our struggles mentioned above?
