During that time you may want to reflect on the sermon or Bible reading. You may also want to pray one of these prayers below.

Prayer for those searching for truth

Lord Jesus, you claim to be the way, the truth, and the life. Grant that I might be undaunted by the cost of following you as I consider the reasons for doing so. If what you claim is true, please guide me, teach me, and open to me who you are. Give me an understanding of you that leads to the life that you promise. Amen.

Prayer of belief

Lord Jesus, I admit that I am weaker and more sinful than I ever before believed, but through you I am more loved and accepted than I ever dared hope. I thank you for paying my debt, bearing my punishment on the cross, and offering forgiveness and new life. Knowing that you have been raised from the dead, I turn from my sins and receive you as Saviour and Lord. Amen.

Prayer for those struggling with sin

Lord Jesus, enable me to lay aside the sin that clings so closely, and run with perseverance the race set before me, looking to you, the pioneer and perfecter of my faith. Amen.

Each year, we use our offertory from our Christmas day services to support Anglican Aid's Instika Campaign in South Africa. The Intsika Community Outreach Programme is helping underprivileged children on the outskirts of Port Elizabeth through a partnership with the Reformed Evangelical Anglican Church of South Africa. These communities live in extreme poverty – many do not have water or



electricity in their homes and can't afford essential school supplies. There is a high rate of disease, HIV and Tuberculosis, alcohol problems, unemployment and family breakdown. Intsika was established in 2016 to prepare young children for school and support them through their primary education. Christmas is all about God's generosity to us.
