Vision Series Week Four

This is week four of our Vision Series. In this week's instalment, we focus on the place of young people in our church. Over the past two and a half years, we have made a concerted effort to centre kids and youth in our church life. We have aimed to place them on a pathway that introduces and develops biblical faith. We have sought to do this from the youngest of ages. No child is too young to hear about Jesus. We have also sought to reinforce the importance of SRE in our ministry life. We are currently two SRE teachers short. Have you considered this ministry? Chat with Pippie for more details.

Mission Gift Day and Celebration Sunday

Next Sunday is the final Sunday of our Vision Month. We will spend time focussing on our life together and how that might be beautified by the gospel. To help us do this we have several ways for you to participate:

- 1. **Mission Gift Day:** Currently, our budget sets aside 6% of our giving to support our link missionaries (people who bring the gospel to other people groups). To supplement our giving, we encourage church members to give a one-off gift to our link missionaries. We collect this one-off gift next Sunday and through bank transfer in the ensuing weeks. We hope to raise **\$20,000**. You can give using our 'Give' page on the website or bank transfer (details on the front cover). Use "MissionGift" in your payment ref.
- 2. **Thanksgiving and Prayer:** As a way of recognising that God is the source of all good things, we want to finish our services next Sunday with a time of thanksgiving. People will have a chance to share what they are thankful for, and we will spend time in prayer.
- 3. Celebration Brunch or Dinner: Our morning services will combine and run at 9:45am on Sunday 28th. Following the morning service, we will celebrate over brunch. We encourage you to remain and enjoy the yummy brunch together. Our usual morning services will resume the following week. In the evening we will hold a celebration dinner after our 5:30pm Service. Both meals are free.

Kids and Youth @ St. Stephen's
