Father, forgive us. Strengthen us to love and obey you in newness of life; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

He forgave us all our sins, <sup>14</sup>having cancelled the charge of our legal indebtedness, which stood against us and condemned us; he has taken it away, nailing it to the cross.

#### Gospel and Prayer (GaP) Group Questions

1. C.S. Lewis famously wrote: I am trying here to prevent anyone saying the really foolish thing that people often say about Him: I'm ready to accept Jesus as a great moral teacher, but I don't accept his claim to be God. That is the one thing we must not say. A man who was merely a man and said the sort of things Jesus said would not be a great moral teacher. He would either be a lunatic — on the level with the man who says he is a poached egg — or else he would be the Devil of Hell. You must make your choice. Either this man was, and is, the Son of God, or else a madman or something worse.

Which of the options do you think your friends/family/ neighbours consider him to be? Why?

#### Read Colossians 1:15-23

#### Getting your head around the passage:

Use as many questions as you need to ensure you understand the passage's contents.

- 1. What adjectives are used to describe Jesus?
- 2. List the various things attributed to Jesus.
- 3. How does creation relate to Jesus?
- 4. How are you described?
- 5. What is this passage contingent on? What are the conditions of God's offer?
- 2. If Christ is above all powers and circumstances, what comfort can it bring?

- 3. What impedes us from believing that Jesus is no. 1?
- 4. What can we deliberately or inadvertently (blind spots) make no.1? Why is this tragic?
- 5. What is offered to those who accept and enact Jesus as no.1? How can that actually reshape our 'blind spots'?



### GaP Group Reflection Watch the video provided to your group leader.

- 1. Who was the most influential person in your story of coming to faith? What did they do? What was their impact?
- 2. Who can you pray for and bring to the 'Taste of Life' event?

- Acknowledge to your group an area of your life where you struggle to make Jesus no.1. Ask God for forgiveness.
- 2. Pray that God would remind you of the hope Jesus offers in that area of life.
