On this Sunday before Anzac Day, we remember the sacrifice of those who served in wars past. We will take a moment to reflect on those who lovingly sacrificed so that others could gain. We will remember that they answered a higher calling, one that transcended their day-to-day doings and responsibilities. Something more urgent and critical caused them to valiantly leave much behind.

Sacrificial love and responding to a higher calling are core themes of the Christian message. Today, we also finish our sermon series in John's Gospel. In this final story recorded by Jesus's close friend John, Jesus gives his closest friends a special lesson. It's a lesson about responding rightly and sacrificially to a higher calling.




