Redevelopment of the Property

Wardens, Parish Council and our Senior Minister have been working hard on refining the development proposal and considering the options. In the last 2 weeks we have worked towards signing a Specified Property Enabling Consent (SPEC) which allows the Anglican Church Growth Corporation to begin more indepth work for the redevelopment.

The signing of the SPEC allows us to pursue the best options for development. The decision to sign the SPEC was taken after months of consultation and broad and positive consensus on the development as currently envisaged. This is a major step toward developing the property and commits us to develop it in a feasible way that aligns with the core goals of the development we presented at the Town Hall.
