The Lord's Prayer


This is the prayer that Jesus taught his disciples to pray (Matthew 6:5-14).

- 6. How can the answer to question 5 transform our attitudes to the poor and our wealth & possessions?

Prayer

- A. Spend time confessing the areas where you find generosity difficult.
- B. Ask God to transform your attitudes to wealth & possessions in light of the gospel.

Reflections from Reach Australia

The staff along with parish members (Nina Shou & Liz Cooper) visited the Reach Australia Conference last week.

The conference has run for 6 years and aims to engage ministry leaders in an intentional and coherent way of running our church life and ministry. This year the primary focus was how to build bible shaped community.



The team was greatly encouraged with the content and came away with a number of key areas to focus on. Over the coming months we will introduce you to some proposed changes to Pastoral Care, music ministry and welcoming which we have grappled with. Our great desire is God will create a beautiful community shaped by the Gospel which reminds people of our lasting hope in Christ.
