Conversations About Hope





We packed out the upstairs room of Willoughby Hotel at our Conversations about Hope on Wednesday 17 May. The panellists spoke interestingly and winsomely about the topic of hope from their personal experiences and areas of research/expertise. Most importantly, they expanded on the solid and eternal hope that Jesus alone can offer—"a joyful expectation of the future, based on true events in the past, that changes everything about my present."

We had around 20 guests attend, and many said the pub was a great setting and the topic relevant. We hope to run a similar event in the future.

Hope Explored Course

When we read the Gospel accounts of Jesus, we see that many of the people Jesus met took a long time to discover who Jesus really was and what He came to do, before coming to faith in Him. This is true



not just of them but for many of us too—we need the time and space to explore, ask, reflect and discover who Jesus is and the hope He offers us.

This is why we are running the Hope Explored course. This course is running for the next two Wednesday nights at Willoughby Hotel, 7-9pm. Each night, there is time to eat/drink and connect with others, watch a short video explaining the hope offered in the story and person of Jesus, and a chance to ask questions and see what the Bible says about Jesus and the hope He offers. Everyone is welcome to come along.

Square One Camp

Square One is a weekend camp for those in year 3-6. We join with kids from other churches all over Sydney to learn from the Bible, sing and make unforgettable memories! It's a chance for our kids to have a camp experience alongside leaders they know while being part of something bigger.
