Sermon Notes

Who does God choose? | Genesis 25:19-34, 26:34-27:46, 28:10-22

Preacher: Gordon Luk

1. God does not choose based on human categories (Gen 25:19-34)

2. God does not choose based on human merit (Gen 26:34-27:46)

3. God chooses to open heaven up to unworthy people through Christ (Gen 28:10-22)

Gospel and Prayer (GaP) Group Study

1. What is the strangest dream you've had?

Read Gen 28:1-22

Getting your head around the passage:

Use as many questions as you need to ensure you understand the passage's contents.

- A. What is "the blessing of Abraham" (v. 4) from your memory of Genesis so far?
- B. Why is Jacob running away?
- C. Draw a picture of his dream (v. 12-15)
- D. List out the promises God gives to Jacob in this dream (v. 13-15)
- E. What is Jacob's feeling and response to God after seeing the vision?

Read Gen 22:17-18

- 2. How does God's promises to Jacob (Gen 28:13-15) compare with His promises to Abraham? Why does this matter?
- 3. What do you think the vision of the ladder/stairway to heaven is all about? (See how Jacob reacts to the vision in v. 17) What do you think God is trying to show Jacob?
- 4. Given what Jacob has done in Genesis 27, why is it remarkable that God shows this vision to Jacob and makes these promises to him?

Read John 1:51

- 5. How is Jacob's vision of the ladder to heaven actually a picture of Jesus and what He has come to do?
- 6. Discuss how God chose to reveal the way to heaven to an unworthy man in Jacob is a reflection of how He chose to meet us in Jesus.

Prayer

- A. Pray that God would help us marvel at His grace to us in choosing us not based on our works or merit.
- B. Pray that we would not restrict anyone in our hearts from coming to Christ, who is the only way to heaven.



GaP Group Reflection

Watch the video provided to your GaP Group leader and consider the following questions:

- i. What parts of the Bible are you currently reading? Do you find it easy or hard to regularly read the Bible?
- ii. How can your group encourage each other to read, reflect and respond to the Bible on a regular basis through the week?

- 1. What makes me uncomfortable about how God relates with Isaac/Jacob? What does this show me about God that I need to see?
