If what you claim is true, please guide me, teach me, and open to me who you are. Give me an understanding of you that leads to the life that you promise. Amen.

## Prayer of belief

Lord Jesus, I admit that I am weaker and more sinful than I ever before believed, but through you I am more loved and accepted than I ever dared hope. I thank you for paying my debt, bearing my punishment on the cross, and offering forgiveness and new life. Knowing that you have been raised from the dead, I turn from my sins and receive you as Saviour and Lord. Amen.

## Prayer for those struggling with sin

Lord Jesus, enable me to lay aside the sin that clings so closely, and run with perseverance the race set before me, looking to you, the pioneer and perfecter of my faith. Amen.

- 2. Remind your group of the events of Gen 26:34-27:41. What are the similarities between those events and the passage we are study this week?
- 3. Why might these similarities exist?
- 4. In John 8:44 Jesus calls the devil the 'father of all lies'. Do you experience deception & lies in your life and interactions? Is it an area you yourself have struggled with at times?

#### Read John 1:8-10

- 5. What kind of false accusations can the devil throw at us to keep us from God?
- 6. How can the good news of Jesus frees us to respond in truth?

- A. Share one area where you like to see less deception in your life.
- B. Spend time confessing your sins together as a group.
