

1. What has struck you from the Psalms series over the past weeks?

Read Psalm 12

- 1. What are the people lamenting over?
- 2. Why is the world so bad?
- 3. How is the word of God different?
- 4. What is it that God says he will do? Who does he do this for?
- 5. Has the world changed by the end of the psalm?
- 2. Why do we lie at times? What are the things that drive us to lie?

3. Is hypocrisy something that you struggle with? Where do you see this arise? What situations prompt you to behave that way?

Read John 1:14

4. What is poignant about the way John describes Jesus in this passage? Why do you think he uses this language?

5. What is the challenge and hope for liars in the life and ministry of Jesus?

6. If you know you are loved deeply by Jesus and his love is offered to you for free, how can this help deal with the things that drive us to lie at times?

Prayer Time

- A. Spend time confessing the ways lying creeps into your life. Ask God for his forgiveness and grace.
- B. Ask God to give you a richer sense of his mercy and unconditional love so you can better avoid the temptation to lie.
