

- E. What did Paul seek to avoid in his ministry?
- F. Why did the Thessalonians suffer?
- 2. What is inspiring & challenging about the model of leadership Paul describes in this chapter?

3. Paul established expectations for every church (member and leader) through the example of the Thessalonians. How would you summarise these? Which is most challenging for you?

4. Reflect on your answers to question 1. Are you aware of the impact of people's words and opinions on your life as a follower of Jesus? How can you be more confronted by the unhelpful impact it might have?

Read 1 Timothy 1:12-17

- 5. How has Jesus's ministry to Paul shaped his ministry? What has Jesus given him? Is that relevant to what we've been discussing?
- 6. How can the good news which Paul lives off help you extinguish the power of other people's opinions? How can it make our church vibrant in line with the example of the Thessalonians?

Prayer Time

- A. Does the Holy Spirit bear witness with your spirit that you are child of God because of faith in the gospel? Ask him to do so.
- B. Pray your status as one loved by God might shape your attitude to God and his people.

Watch the video provided to your GaP Group leader and consider the following questions:

- i. Ask those who attended the pub event, Conversations about the Good Life, on Tuesday, to reflect on it. If you meet prior, discuss who you would like to bring.
- ii. Pray for those you are inviting / brought to the event.
