Sermon Notes

We Belong to the Future | 1 Thessalonians 5:1-11 Preacher: Gordon Luk

1. The Day of the Lord (v. 1-3)

2. We belong to the Day (v. 4-7)

3. Our Future Destiny is Salvation through Christ (v. 8-11)

Gospel and Prayer (GaP) Group Study

1. Do you think your friends or family are mostly optimistic or pessimistic about the future of our world? Discuss why.

Read 1 Thessalonians 5:1-11

Getting your head around the passage:

Use as many questions as you need to ensure you understand the passage's contents.

A. What is Paul writing to them about (v.1)? What do you think is the question he's seeking to address?

- B. How does Paul answer that question (v.2-3)?
- C. What is Paul's encouragement (v.6)?
- D. What kind of reasoning does he use (v.5, 7)?
- E. What does it mean to "be sober" (v.8)?

F. Which parts of this passage relate to what God is doing in the future, what He's done in the past, and what we should do in the present?

2. There are two errors that we can fall into regarding the Day of the Lord. One is to over-obsess about it beyond what the Scriptures tell us—what are the times and dates etc. (v.1)? The other error is to not think about it at all being "asleep" and not alert/sober (v.6-8). Which error are you more tempted to fall into? What are the dangers of it?

3. How does "belonging to the night or to the darkness" (v.5) explain how most people live and act in the present? How does it relate to what they know about the future of the world?

4. When do you find it hard to "be sober" and "alert" to the future Day? What makes it hard?

5. The gospel articulated in verses 9-10 are more than just true events in the past, but how they secure our future. Why do you think Paul puts this after his encouragement to the Thessalonians to be sober? What did Christ endure in the past that changes our present identity and our future hope?

6. Our identity in the gospel is that we are children of the light and of the day (v.5). How will knowing that this is who you are change you and how you face the next:

- a. Day,
- b. Few weeks/months, and
- c. Year?

Prayer Time

Split into smaller groups:

1. Confess to God your struggles and failures where you haven't been living in light of the Day and have been "asleep".

2. Ask God to remind your heart of the gospel truths and its future realities, so that you can live in light of your glorious eternal future.

GaP Group Reflection Watch the video provided to your GaP Group leader and consider the following questions:

i. Think of a recent conversation with a friend, how much balance was there between your listening and your speaking?

ii. What are some helpful questions you could ask to restart a conversation or keep one going?

Read the Bible with us!

1. What does Jesus promise?

2. What encouragement/warning does He give concerning how we should live in preparation for the future?
