Prayer for those searching for truth

If what you claim is true, please guide me, teach me, and open to me who you are. Give me an understanding of you that leads to the life that you promise. Amen.

Prayer of belief

Lord Jesus, I admit that I am weaker and more sinful than I ever before believed, but through you I am more loved and accepted than I ever dared hope. I thank you for paying my debt, bearing my punishment on the cross, and offering forgiveness and new life. Knowing that you have been raised from the dead, I turn from my sins and receive you as Saviour and Lord. Amen.

Prayer for those struggling with sin

Lord Jesus, enable me to lay aside the sin that clings so closely, and run with perseverance the race set before me, looking to you, the pioneer and perfecter of my faith. Amen.

Gospel and Prayer (GaP) Group Study

1. What purpose has the local church served in your life and the world around you? How has that influenced your thinking about the purpose of the local church?

Read Revelation 7:9-12

Getting your head around the passage:

Use as many questions as you need to ensure you understand the passage's contents.

- A. What things does John see in the vision?
- B. What does he hear?
- C. What are they doing?
- D. What are they wearing?
- E. What does the crowd, the sounds, sights, actions, and clothing symbolise?
- 2. If Revelation 7 is a glimpse of the church God has committed to build, what is surprising and/or encouraging to you from this insight?
- 3. If we (as a local church) are a stepping stone to this ultimate reality, what might we hope to see happen in our midst?
- 4. What fears, doubts, distractions tend to discourage you from this vision of the ultimate church and the local church?

5. How can refocussing on God through his word and in the discipline of prayer give us optimism for the purpose of the local church? How can it remove distractions and deal with our fears?

6. How can the prayer life of your group change this year to be soaked in God's promises?

- 2. Ask God to give you a growing love for his local church and his purpose for the local church.
