#### Read 1 Cor 1:18-2:5

#### Getting your head around the passage:

Choose as many of these questions as you need to get your head around the passage.

- A. What two groups are described in vv.18-25? How are they differentiated?
- B. How is God viewed in comparison to the world?
- C. How is the church described in vv.26-31?
- D. What words/phrases does Paul use to describe his ministry in 2:1-5?
- E. What does Paul rely upon?

- 2. Consider these summaries of Paul's teaching. Assuming they are accurate summaries, what do you think people would find unappealing about them?

3. Why can you be reluctant to humble yourself? How can we use good works and virtues to avoid the humble position Paul calls us to adopt for ourselves?

4. The gospel is summarised in v.30. What is so appealing about the gospel is we have ears to hear it? How does it address some of the fears and reluctance raised in the previous question?
5. What great attributes will we see in a church shaped by a gospel which cancels out boasting (v.31)?

## **Prayer Time**

- 1. Spend time sharing the way selfish ambition, self-esteem (or lack thereof) and other things hinder your ability to humble yourself.
- 2. Give thanks for God's mercy in calling you in spite of your failings. Ask him to encourage you with his gracious character this week.
