A Church Built on the Word 1 Corinthians 2:6-16 Preacher: Gordon Luk
The Great Knowledge/Wisdom Divide
1. The gospel declares God's wisdom (v. 6-11)
a. you can't get it by human intelligence (v. 6-9)
b. it's a hidden mystery only revealed by God's Spirit (v. 10-11)
2. The Spirit brings true spirituality through God's Word (v. 12-16)
a. He teaches us the deep things of God by God's Word (v. 12-13)
b. The truly spiritual person (v. 14-16)

The Great Gospel Divide — "we have the mind of Christ" (v. 16)

Gospel and Prayer (GaP) Group Study

1. How prevalent was the pursuit of knowledge/education/wisdom at different stages of your life? Share with each other.

Read 1 Corinthians 2:6-16

Getting your head around the passage:

Choose as many of these questions as you need to get your head around the passage.

- A. Find all the occurrences of the word "wisdom" in the passage and discuss.
- B. Find all the occurrences of the word "Spirit" in the passage and discuss.
- C. How does this passage seek to do what Paul says in verse 5?
- D. Try to split up the passage into 3-4 smaller sections.
- 2. How do you feel about God's wisdom being unattainable and inconceivable by you? How counter-cultural is this to our world which idolises human intelligence?

- 3. How might this passage (particularly verses 10-13) speak against the following attitudes? Which one are you more likely to have.
- "I treat my knowledge/study of God as academic rather than personal."
- "I treat my spirituality/spiritual relationship with God as something separate to my study of God's Word."

- 4. Why might the attitudes above be dangerous to a church and cause division? How does this passage help us guard against that?5. What amazes you about this passage and what God has freely and
- 5. What amazes you about this passage and what God has freely and graciously given to us?

6. How might this make you "boast in the Lord" this week?

Prayer Time

- 1. Share with each other your struggles/joys of being in the Word this week. How have you been challenged by this passage to let God's Spirit teach you by God's Word?
- 2. Pray for each other and for our church to marvel at God's grace to us and to fight against worldly temptations to divide/judge each other based on wisdom and knowledge.

Read the Bible with us!

- 1. What difference does God's Spirit in us make?
- 2. What in this passage makes you want to say "Thank you, Lord!"
- 3. Spend time praising and thanking God for His Spirit in you.


