Gospel and Prayer (GaP) Group Study

Monday - Genesis 12:1-4

- How does this differ from the world's attitudes?
- How does he model and exceed what he calls us to do?

- What is surprising about this account?
- What should the model of Jesus encourage us to do?
- How does Jesus's ministry deal with failure of his people to live servant hearted lives?
