# Prayers for those not sharing in Lord's Supper

Participation in the Lord's Supper is for those who have professed faith in Jesus - it's a powerful and important symbol of the Christian message. As such we want to encourage those who are still exploring the Christian faith to feel free to remain in their seats when others move to the front to receive the Lord's Supper. During that time you may want to reflect on the sermon or Bible reading. You may also want to pray one of these prayers below.

#### Prayer for those searching for truth

Lord Jesus, you claim to be the way, the truth, and the life. Grant that I might be undaunted by the cost of following you as I consider the reasons for doing so. If what you claim is true, please guide me, teach me, and open to me who you are. Give me an understanding of you that leads to the life that you promise. Amen.

# Prayer of belief

Lord Jesus, I admit that I am weaker and more sinful than I ever before believed, but through you I am more loved and accepted than I ever dared hope. I thank you for paying my debt, bearing my punishment on the cross, and offering forgiveness and new life. Knowing that you have been raised from the dead, I turn from my sins and receive you as Saviour and Lord. Amen.

# **Sermon Notes**

The Lord's Supper   1 Corinthians 11:17-34
Preacher: Gordon Luk
"We are who we eat with"
1. The importance of gospel culture: Paul's big rebuke (v. 17-22)
2. The gospel sign given by Jesus: The Lord's Supper (v. 23-26)
3. The gospel transforms who we are and who we eat with: "receiving one another" (v. 28-34)

# Gospel and Prayer (GaP) Group Study

1. "Eating is a social act". Discuss in your groups. Do you personally think much about who you eat with?

#### Read 1 Corinthians 11:17-34

#### Getting your head around the passage:

Choose as many of these questions as you need to get your head around the passage.

- A. What is Paul rebuking the Corinthians about (v. 17-21)?
- B. How serious is this to Paul (v. 22)?
- C. What are the two purposes of the Lord's Supper? (v. 24, 25, 26)
- D. How did the way in which the Corinthians took the Lord's Supper communicate something opposite to the gospel? (ie. "in an unworthy manner")
- E. What is the difference between God's discipline of the Christian and God's condemnation of the world (v. 32)?
- 2. What's our "eating culture" like at church (think not just of the Lord's Supper but also post-church meals, supper/morning tea, who we invite to meals at our homes etc)? Discuss whether you think it promotes the gospel we preach or not.
- 3. How might we bring a mindset of worldly individualism into our Christian faith? How does this passage challenge that?

4. How does remembering and proclaiming the Cross (through the Lord's Supper and mutual Christian encouragement) help us be a church that is about "one another" rather than "myself"?

5. What is challenging and comforting about the gospel promise in verse 32? What does it teach you about who God is, what He cares about, and what He's done for us?

6. What is one thing this month you'd like the Spirit's help in as you let the gospel shape how you relate with others at church?

#### **Prayer Time**

- 1. Share with each other what you said for Q5 and confess these things in awe and worship of God.
- 2. Share with each other what you said for Q6, and pray that God would help you.

#### Read the Bible with us!

- 1. What do these passages tell us about God, what He desires, and what Jesus was like?
- 2. What picture of the Body of Christ does this paint?
